STUDENTS MEET TONITE

All student meeting will be held at 9:30 tonight in ARH auditorium to discuss the SAC strike. Officially an open senate meeting, the gathering will be chaired by SCA President Andy Loewi.

Union negotiator Paul Neal will be present to discuss the union's position. The meeting will cover the college and the union positions on negotiations, points of agreement and disagreement, and discussions of support tactics for students.

1ST TALK SINCE STRIKE

The college and the union met today for the first time since the strike began. Both sides said that no "substantive progress" had been made.

The meeting, held over breakfast, was termed extremely informal by participants who felt it was simply a "chance to get to know each other."

Negotiations will not be held today however, since the college lawyer, Jim Rogers, will be visiting relatives.

Earlier this week, union representative Paul Neil met for lunch with Dean of Administration Walker. At that time Neil told Walker that the union was ready to resume negotiations. Since that time the college has not formally responded.

PICKETS GO ALL NIGHT

Strike pickets are now being maintained 24 hours a day. On Monday, the first day of the strike, picketing continued only until evening. Sneaky Sage Chuck, however, had his supplies delivered under cover of darkness.

Starting Tuesday, pickets are out around the clock at food service delivery points. Student supporters are needed for the night time shifts. Contact a strike coordinator.

STRIKE SUPPORT FUND

The strike support fund has rapidly accumulated a substantial amount of money to help B&G workers meet expenses during the strike.

Student fund chairman Mike Penzner said that by this afternoon over \$400 had been raised by students.

Steve Johnson, who is coordinating faculty contributions, told the Daily Striker that between 11am and 1pm today he raised over \$210 from faculty members. Johnson added that more money has been pledged by faculty members who will receive their paychecks on Monday.

Faculty support of the strike continues to grow. This afternoon over a dozen faculty members joined workers and students in picket lines around the campus.
